

SYNOPSIS

The Student Category of the Lysaght Inspirations Design Awards allows current and recent (within two years) architecture and design students to participate without needing to submit a constructed building, unlike other categories.

The Student Category of the Lysaght Inspirations Design Awards is therefore a conceptual project only, responding to the enclosed brief. The key requirement of the submission is that your building design must prominently utilise products from the LYSAGHT® range as the main building material elements.

With a cash prize of \$2,500 available for this category, how you choose to present your design is also up to you – plans, drawings, renders, mood boards and written rationale are all acceptable.

INTRODUCTION

Since its successful introduction in 2018, the Lysaght Inspirations Design Awards has celebrated outstanding Australian architectural and building design work that incorporates LYSAGHT® steel building products.

Again in 2024, Lysaght has included an awards category exclusively for students and recent graduates. This category is open to all architectural or building design students currently enrolled at Australian universities and colleges.

The winning entrant judged to have best incorporated LYSAGHT® steel building products into a major conceptual design – will receive a cash prize of \$2,500.





AWARDS ENTRY BRIEF

PROJECT SCOPE

For the purposes of the Student Design Competition, entrants should be guided by the following fictitious scenario:

- You have secured a role with a medium sized residential home building company. The company's clients can be both individuals and developers.
- The company specialises in bespoke home designs for a clientele looking for something with a design statement not available from "off the shelf" project homes.
- While the company's clientele are often focussed on overall build cost, your company prides itself on delivering sustainable, resilient and attractive home designs, while also delivering a liveable space that suits the client's lifestyle and budget.
- In addition to standalone single occupancy designs, the company also regularly receives briefs for dual occupancy solutions as a way of improving the overall project affordability for clients.

CLIENT BRIEF

Your company has been asked to submit concept home designs for a new residential housing development.

The development sits on the fringes of a major metropolitan area and will feature land sizes from 600m² to 1200m².

The developer is keen to not impose a strict design covenant across the new development and prefers to build a new community where the homeowner is able to build new residence that reflects their individual preferences.

In promoting this new development the client wishes to present prospective buyers with conceptual house designs that would suit the new residential community.

As part of the brief your company has received the client has referenced the five **Lysaght Design Guides** as appropriate to their design vision.

The client has provided some fundamental requirements:

- Typical occupants for the new homes will be varied, from a young couple purchasing their first home, an established family needing a larger home through to empty-nesters looking to downsize to a smaller property with minimal maintenance requirement.
- The residences must be able to provide a comfortable environment in both the heat of summer and the lower temperatures of winter – in doing this the client wishes to strive for a minimal environmental footprint rather than relying solely on powered air conditioning/ heating systems
- The client shares your company's passion for resilient, sustainable housing and is keen to see how these values can be at the forefront of design thinking of these residences.

Your company has asked you to provide the design for one of its concept design submissions to this client brief. You have the freedom to choose which design direction you would like to incorporate into your submission – Hamptons, Contemporary, Coastal, Queenslander or Heritage.



AWARDS ENTRY BRIEF

COMPETITION BRIEF

Entrants are asked to provide a conceptual design for one new residential property for the new clients development, utilising extensively the LYSAGHT® range of steel building products, and based off one of the 5 themes of the Lysaght Design Guides.

The objective of the award is to select a student who, having considered the quality, strengths and potential of LYSAGHT® steel building products*, can successfully incorporate them into a major project.

Entrants will also need to demonstrate their capability to:

- Interpret the client brief and develop an understanding of where the LYSAGHT® range of products can be utilised in delivering a solution
- Present a design of outstanding architectural and building design merit, which meets the objectives and functional requirements outlined in the fictional client brief above
- Balance competing priorities, and work within the parameters of the project brief

By including the Student Category to the Lysaght Inspirations Design Awards, Lysaght is seeking to provide students with a real opportunity to not only express their creativity, but also consider and familiarise themselves with the design possibilities and applications of LYSAGHT® steel building products.

SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Given the conceptual nature of the Student Category of the Lysaght Inspirations Design Awards, there are no detailed submission requirements in terms of length or structure.

Entries must be submitted in PDF format and can only be received via the Awards website: www.lysaghtinspirations.com

Entrants are free to detail their submissions as they wish, within the constraints of the awards website. Keeping in mind that they will be judged by a panel of experts and they will be competing against a large field of their peers, they are encouraged to use whatever means they need to bring their designs to life.

Entries can be lodged from 01/06/2024 with the deadline for submissions being 01/09/2024.
